

Landscape Quilt Kit (\$25) and Supply List

Students must have the book "Lovely Landscape Quilts" by Cathy Geier for reference during class.

Kit contents - students can supply these themselves if they choose not to purchase the kit, or prefer to make a different quilt:

1. Water soluble glue stick (must be a fresh stick – these dry out fast)
2. Pattern paper 23 by 24 inches: Create A Pattern by Bosal, Easy Pattern Tracing Cloth by Pellon or Pattern Tracing Material from Nancy's Notions are examples
3. Paper pattern - if you choose your own pattern design, adjust all the supplies below to fit your own pattern
 - a. Landscape strip layout
 - b. Tree and sailboat
4. Fusible web such as Steam A Seam™ 12 by 16 inches
5. Black Pimatex™ or similar (high thread count cotton) 12 by 16 inches for the tree and sailboat
6. Fabric strips (batiks are best) - treat thoroughly with starch, sizing or "Best Press™" before cutting
 - a. Water fabrics assorted blue green, 13 inch strips: 1 ¼ inch, 1 ½ in, 2 in, 2 ¼ in wide
 - b. Beach fabrics assorted sand/tan, 7 inch strips: 1 ¼ inch, 1 ½ in, 2 in, 2 ¼ in wide
 - c. Land fabrics assorted brown/green, 13 inch strips: 1 ¼ inch, 1 ½ in, 2 in, 2 ¼ in wide
 - d. Sky fabrics 21 inch strips
 - i. Yellow 1 ½ in wide
 - ii. Pink 1 ½ in wide
 - iii. Orange 1 ¾ in wide
 - iv. Red orange or violet orange 2 in wide
 - v. Medium value Violet/purple 1 ¾ in wide
 - vi. Dark purple 2 in wide
 - vii. Light/medium blue, 2 in wide
 - viii. Medium blue, 1 ¼ in wide
 - ix. Navy blue, 2 ½ in wide

Students should bring the following supplies not included in the kit:

1. Basic sewing notions: pins, scissors, seam ripper, 24 inch ruler and rotary cutter. In addition to regular scissors, bring a pair of small, very sharp scissors for cutting the applique pieces.
2. Thread: neutral cotton thread such as gray or tan. Most of the colors in this kit are fairly dark, so make it a darker shade rather than a really light one.
3. Monofilament thread: clear nylon or polyester monofilament thread (like very thin fishing line; ask at the store for this if you are not familiar with it)
4. A good pencil or two for drawing the pattern. An ultra fine point Sharpie™ pen or equivalent. An iron-away (Frixion™ pen) marker or water soluble marker. A white iron-away or water soluble marker.
5. Sewing machine with ¼ inch piecing foot if you have it (use regular foot if you don't; just make sure you can sew an accurate ¼ inch seam). An extension table for your machine will be very helpful if you have one. Always bring the manual for your sewing machine to class with you.

6. You will need finish supplies for completing the landscape quilt: fabrics for borders, binding, and quilt back; plus batting. A thin (60 wt) black thread for stitching down the edges of the applique pieces if desired.
